Vernon Water Reclamation Centre

The Centre treats approximately 4500 million liters of influent annually. The high-quality reclaimed water is then pumped 8 km to a reservoir and used as a primary source of irrigation water on approximately 850 ha of agricultural lands, tree farms, sports fields, and three large golf courses.
